HOW DO WE GET THERE – 2021 REALITY

Thanks again to the residents of the Lost Lake Conservancy Taxing District for approving the Bond Ordinance Referendum to implement the Long-Range Plan for dredging our lake. Since the Board began contemplating a major dredging program, we have focused on addressing and answering three fundamental questions: Where were we; Where did we want to go; and How do we get there? Now that the “How Do We Get There” (\$\$\$) has been resolved through the sale of the Bonds, the construction and

dredging activities can begin later this spring. Our Implementation Plan is based on completing the planned dredging before the years’ end 2021. Very soon, the Board will issue respective Requests for Proposals: one for the construction of the permanent silt basin and the other for lake dredging.

As mentioned in last month's Newsletter, the Board is also exploring opportunities to minimize the amount of silt entering our lake in future years. There are two points of entry: Babbling Brook on the north end and Clear Creek on the south end. Over the years, a considerable amount of work has been performed on the Babbling Creek tributary to minimize silt buildup. Recently, we have received a preliminary Clear Creek Improvements Concept Plan from Olson Ecological Solutions , Inc.

and the Board will review that document in the upcoming weeks. The RCD is pursuing potential partnering opportunities with The Nature Conservancy (Nachusa Grasslands), as well as neighboring streamside landowners to form a Priority Watershed Partnership. We are all interested in promoting water quality projects to improve the conditions within the surrounding watershed.

The Board remains committed to serving the best interests of the community. We always look forward to any input. Please continue to visit our website for project updates.
